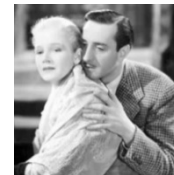
Watch classic films based on books

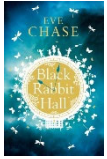

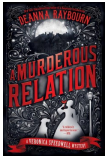

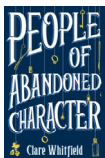


***The Lamplighters* by Emma Stonex.** Decades after the mysterious disappearance of three lighthouse keepers, a writer comes to town seeking answers.
